Individuals must be able to establish trust-based relationships and interact in a calm, respectful, responsive and reciprocal manner with children, parents and other child care providers, ensuring the child's individual care and diverse needs are met. In a Supported Child Development role, you will work towards established goals within the context of the child's daily routine, supporting both the child and the child care program.
