**Job Description: Laboratory Assistant** 

## **Major Responsibilities**

The Laboratory Assistant (LA) will provide technical support for existing and new lab services, including ELISA, PCR, Virology, sample preparation, Sea Lice Bioassay and identification. The LA will assist and help prepare for routine laboratory analysis, sample tracking procedures (intake, logging, storage and handling) and data entry. Other duties include preparing media, helping maintain an inventory of laboratory supplies, assay set up and clean up. The LA will, as required, serve as backup for the other technicians and accordingly must have a good working knowledge of routine laboratory operations including some field sampling that may require extended hours in off-site locations.

#### **Key Activities**

- Assist with RNA/ DNA extractions
- Prepare samples and media for PCR, RT-qPCR analysis
- Receive training in biosafety and general laboratory practices
- Assist with sample preparation for ELISA
- Perform agarose gel electrophoresis, SDS-PAGE, and western blotting/immunoblotting analysis
- Prepare specialized buffers for experimental procedures
- Prepare solutions and culture media
- Document experimental results and procedures
- Assist with sample preparation and inoculation of cell lines
